### Scope of the Workshop:

To provide attendees with updated rules and regulations; identify new areas of accountability and enforcement; identify new areas of documentation and recordkeeping; understand key problem areas and overview "best practices" to lessen the problem in the topic areas of Environmental Issues, OSHA and Building to LEED Requirements.

### Specific Topics:

#### *Environmental Issues*

- New EPA and NE-DEQ mandates and requirements
- SWIPP programs - how to implement and importance of strict adherence
- What are new areas of concern in audit or visitations
- Refresher on documentation/forms/what's needed weekly, monthly, etc.
- Review of installation techniques/best practices for silt fence, bale check, drive off mats, etc.
- Specific problem areas to review including best practices such as fuel storage/containment, dust control, storm sewer, etc.

#### *OSHA*

- Review new regulations for cranes, certified riggers and singleman
- New emphasis-what's new in site visits
- How to prepare for site visits, such as documentation, etc.
- Address multi-employer worksite citations and new administrative changes
- What's the new philosophy as compared to increase in inspectors in area
- Importance of daily inspection reports and other documentation
- What are the current targets
- A quick review of MSDS program and upkeep
- Importance of jobsite housekeeping
