At Work For You

The following are the key components of The Chapter's "Program of work" for our members.

Business Development: Member Directory published online at www.agcnebuilders.com, AGC of America National Directory, contractor locator service via national website www.agc.org, networking at local, state level and national level.

Chapter Meetings: Membership seminars/meetings are held regionally across the state, Fall Conference is held annually. National speakers and industry experts are utilized as much as possible. All events are scheduled between October and May each year.

Excellence in Construction: Several national award programs are in place. A statewide membership educational initiative is being implemented in December 2008. Elevate your company's image by the use of AGC logo and decals to show that you are one of "the best". Members are encouraged to use the AGC logo on company letterhead, job-site signs, business cards and internet sites.

Governmental Issues: Support and represent the industry at economic development activities across the state, provide industry representation, and liaison with public agencies and other sectors of the industry.

Legal Assistance: AGC retains Woods & Aitken, LLC as legal counsel. They provide free initial consultations to member firms.

Legislative Services: The Executive Director is the lobbyist for the association at the state level. Members receive Legislative Update, Legislative Alert and other lobbying services during the sessions. The Chapter conducts candidate surveys and conducts Regional Legislative Meetings. The Legislative Committee determines PAC contribution.

Education/Training: The Chapter provides management training at all levels. National level programs are hosted one to two times per year. AGC of America's Supervisory Training Program is offered via the internet online at break-even cost to members. The Fall Conference features national speakers and seminar topics devoted to management and leadership. Members have access to the AGC of America's Online Institute. This is a very cost effective way to do safety training for your staff.

The Emerging Construction Professionals Forum is for the newer professionals in member firms. The forum focuses on professional development and leadership training.

Workforce Development: The Chapter supports five AGC Student Chapters at the schools of construction in Nebraska. In addition, we provide educational project funds and scholarships. The Construction Career Co-workers project is directed at middle school students in Nebraska schools.

Membership Communication: All Chapter members receive weekly E-Updates, a bi-monthly publication, "Building Chapter News" and Legislative Alerts.

Chapter Governance: The Chapter has a 12-member Board of Directors that meets six times per year. Members are encouraged to become involved and determine the direction of the Association through committee participation. There are four committees that provide guidance to the Executive Director. Most committee meetings take place by telephone conference.

Legal Assistance: AGC retains Woods & Aitken, LLC as legal counsel. They provide free initial consultations to member firms.

AGC of America Services: The state Chapter membership includes the national membership. The AGCA's website provides a vast array of resources and up-to-date information. AGCA Chief Economist provides monthly updates and outlooks at the national and regional levels. AGCA Governmental Affairs is the most influential lobby for the commercial construction industry. The PAC fund is second only to the National Home Builders Association in donations within the industry.
