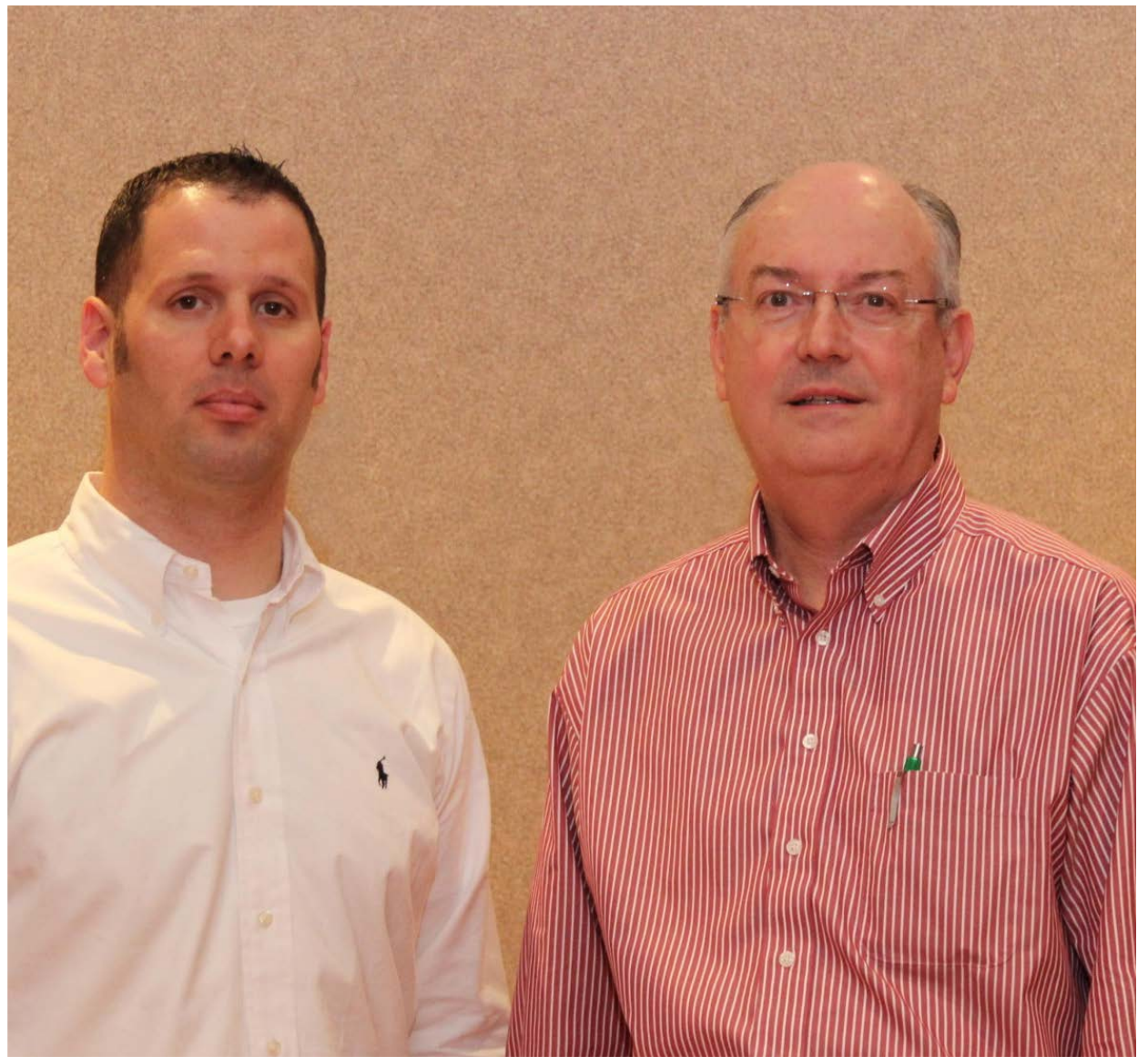

The Nebraska Building Chapter members wish to congratulate and recognize this year's participants for the outstanding leadership they are providing for their selected service projects.



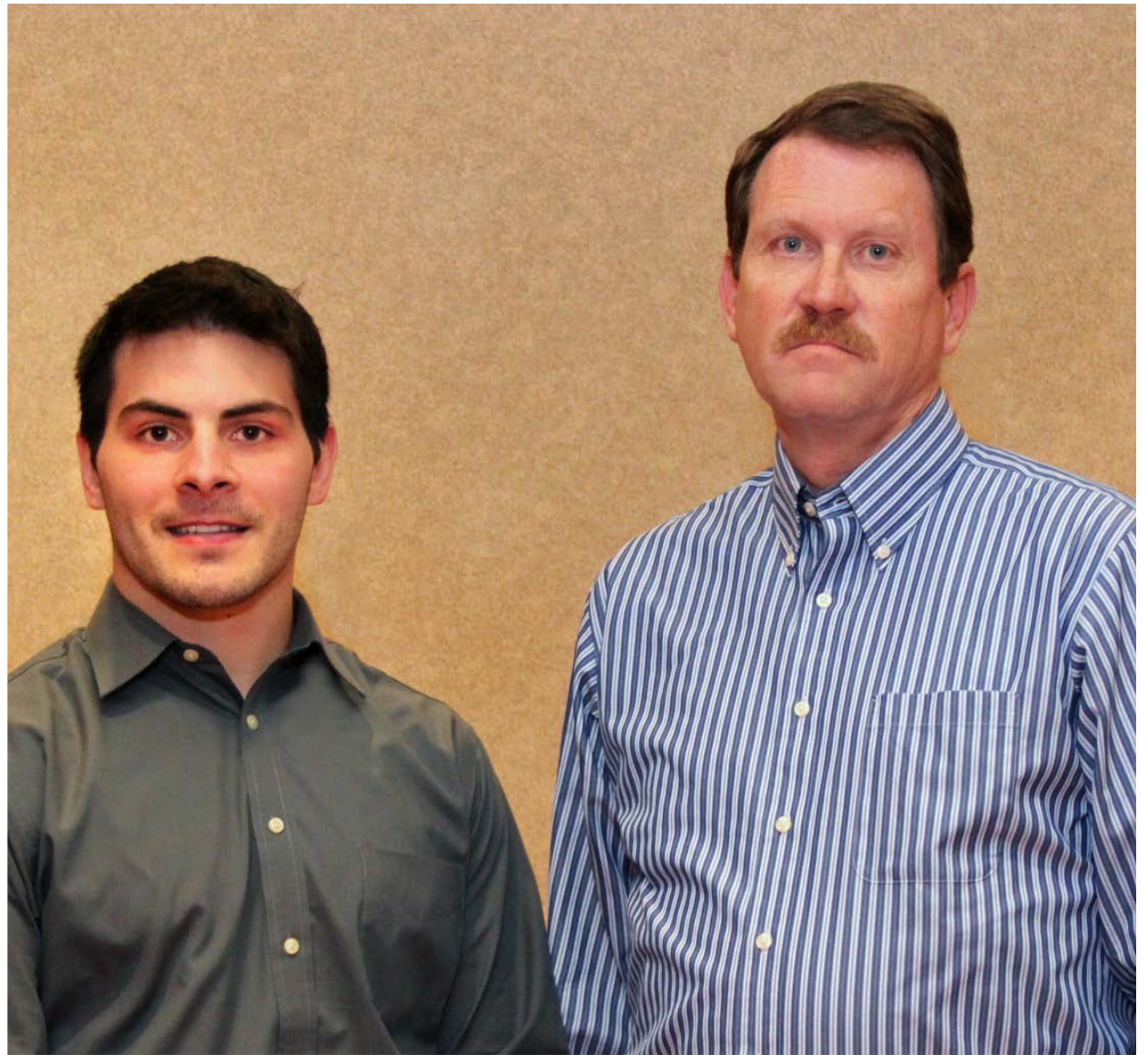

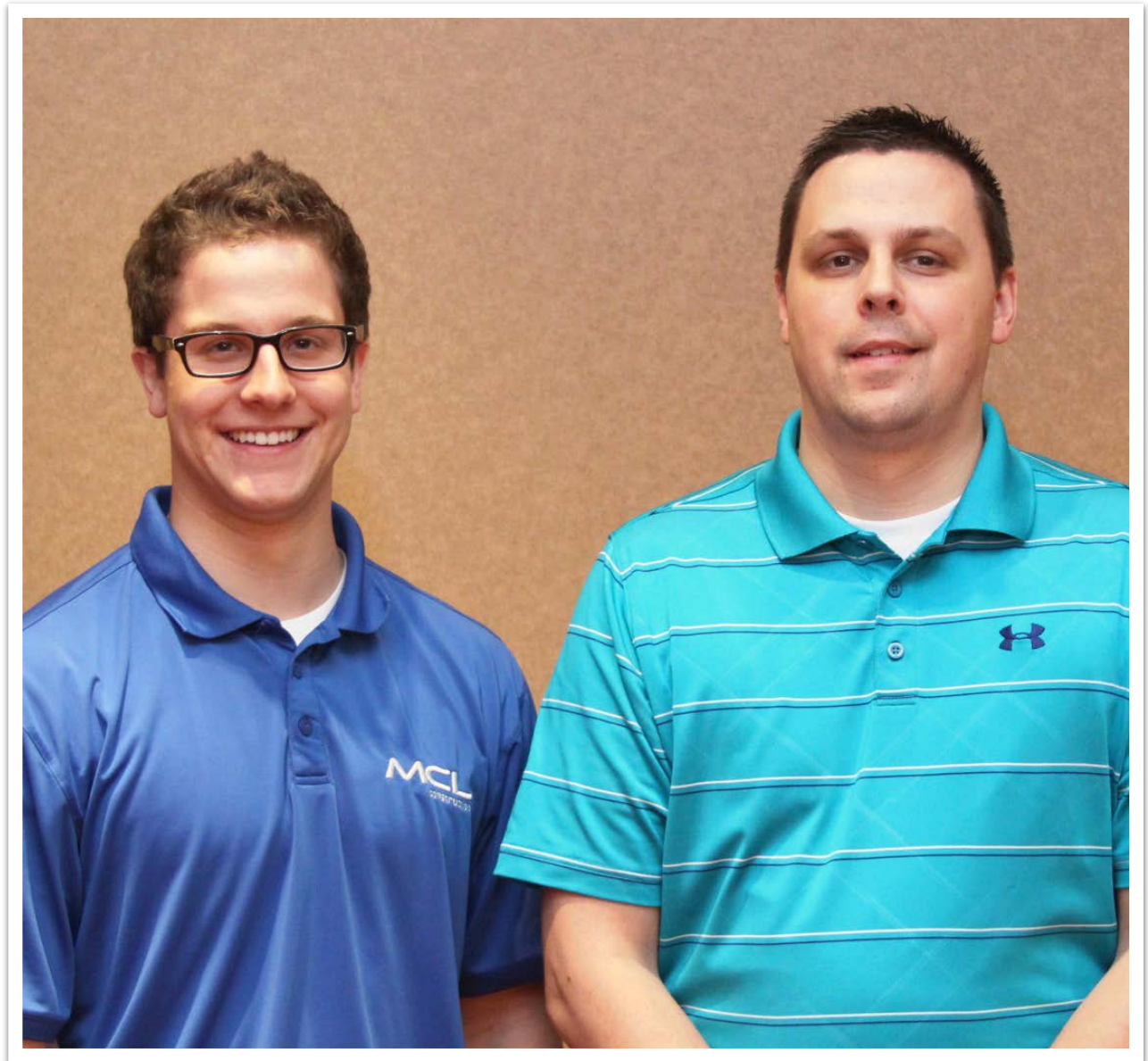
