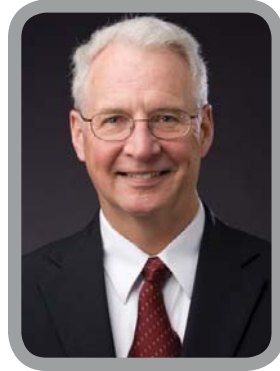

Ken is a Cincinnati native who began work with Dugan & Meyers Construction in Cincinnati in 1968. Starting as an estimator he became Chief Estimator to the Heavy & Highway Division, Project Engineer for the I-471 Brides over the Ohio River, and Project Manager for two treatment plants. After service as a captain in the 15th Combat Engineer Battalion, 9th Infantry Division, Ken joined THP Structural

Engineers in Cincinnati becoming a partner and manager. At THP Ken worked on the design for over 20 steel, reinforced and prestressed concrete buildings, and was project manager for the structural design of the Hamilton County Correctional Facility (\$40 Million structural frame, 10,000 Cy reinforced and and prestressed concrete), prior to leaving to complete PH.D studies at Cornell University in 1982.

In 1982 Ken qualified for a grant from the Exxon Corporation to bring experienced PE's to US colleges of engineering, and began Ph.D. studies at Cornell University in Ithaca, New York. At Cornell Ken teaches reinforced concrete design, concrete materials and construction, and construction management. His research is on the effects of the environment and construction operations on concrete quality, and he has taught cold weather concreting in Minnesota, and hot weather concreting in Arizona, New Mexico, and Saudi Arabia. His is also known for his research and publications in the area of air entrained concrete.

Ken has won top teaching awards at Cornell and in the American Concrete Institute where he is a Fellow and a past president to the ACI Board of Directors. He serves on several ACI committees including the 318 Building Code Committee. Ken develops and presents training courses for many industrial organizations, State Departments of Transportation, and the Federal Highway Administration. He has been the top-rated technical speaker at the World of Concrete nine times.

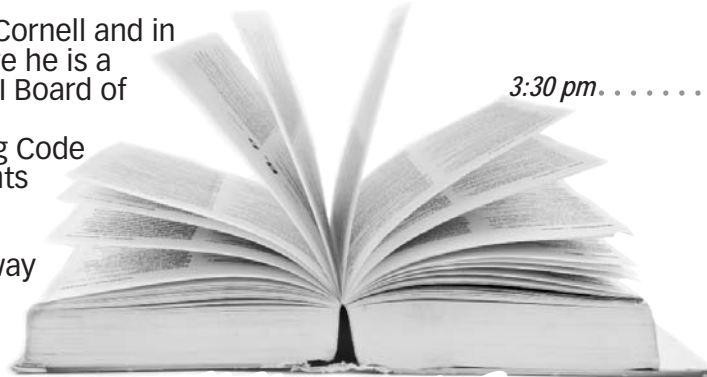
