OSHA is extending the comment period on two initiatives to protect the safety and health of workers. These extensions will allow more time for input from the public.

The comment period for the Emergency Temporary Standard on COVID-19 Vaccination and Testing has been extended to January 19, 2022. The comment period for the consideration of a standard to prevent heat injury and illness in outdoor and indoor work settings has been extended to January 26, 2022.

Cold Weather Safety Tips

When you are outside, frostbite and hypothermia are possible, to protect yourself:

- 1. Wear layers of loose-fitting, lightweight, warm clothing.
- 2. Wear a hat. Try to stay dry and out of the wind.
- 3. Cover your mouth to protect your lungs from extreme cold.
- 4. Mittens, snug at the wrist, are better than gloves.

Vehicle Preparation:

- 1. Check your battery
- 2. Check your fluids (coolant, wiper fluid, oil, etc.)
- 3. Check your tires
- 4. Have jumper cables
- 5. Pack a blanket

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS), from **2015 to 2018**, the Census of Fatal Occupational Injuries (CFOI) reported **103 total trenching and excavation-related deaths**, an average of **25 per year** over this **4-year period**.

Also, the OSHA Information System (OIS) Accident Investigation Report shows that between FY 2013 - FY 2017, there were a total of 156 incidents reported in the construction industry. Moreover, between October 2018 and September 2019, there were 1,499 citations and more than \$7,000,000 in penalties issued to construction employers for failing to meet their compliance obligations under Subpart P.

OSHA's Top 10 most cited violations for FY 2021

Fall Protection - General Requirements (1926.501) has been OSHA's most frequently cited standard for the past 11 fiscal years, and the other standards that make up the agency's "Top 10" list have largely remained unchanged. Although the data may seem stagnant, Patrick Kapust, deputy director of OSHA's Directorate of Enforcement Programs, reminds safety professionals that the figures reinforce the importance of staying vigilant about worker safety and health. This especially rings true now, amid the evolving - and, perhaps, waning - COVID-19 pandemic. *Safety+Health* presents Top 10 data for FY 2021 (which concluded Sept. 30), the penalty box of the year's largest fines.
